## 10 IDEAS FOR CONNECTING WITH YOUR KIDS

- Make a date. Set a weekly date with each child, so you are ensured some alone time with them.
- Read with them. Reread the same book throughout the week.
- Talk to them throughout your day, narrating what you are doing
- Play "Highs and lows". At the dinner table take turns sharing the highs ("roses") and lows ("thorns") from the day.
- Work on a goal or project together
- Get down on the floor and play with them. Children thrive in the context of attention and adult interest and engagement. Stack blocks, color on paper, use sidewalk chalk together outside to create hopscotch. The possibilities are endless!
- Talk to them in the car. Ask about the things they like and the things they dislike.
- Have a Family Day! Build a blanket fort together, play a game of kickball outside together, go on a nature walk at the park or around the block.
- Have a family meeting weekly where you talk about what is coming up in the week ahead, decide family member responsibilities, plan a fun and inexpensive family activity
- Build in some snuggle time with your child. Sometimes a little snuggle connection in the morning can help with the challenge of getting up, getting dressed and getting ready for the day. Think about the idea of "fill first" (with a connector), then make your request.

Even though children learn new words fast, it's still a good idea to repeat the same word frequently."
